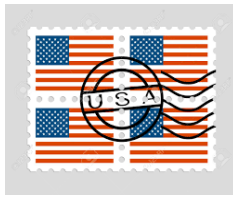

Helpers are need for this ministry. There are several opportunities other than working directly with the needy. Some people have generously donated money instead of donating items (THANK YOU!). As always, you could keep our volunteers' company in the Sharing Room during open hours. Some days are slow, none are crazy busy. SOUP FUNDRAISER and a personal note from Bonnie Fuller



Since changing the schedule to Tuesdays, participation has been down in all areas. The reason for the change was that I (Bonnie) have Thursday morning homeless meetings twice a month, Sharing Room on Thursday afternoons, and, as Lay Leader, Finance, Trustees, and Administrative Council meetings two Thursday evenings. Something had to give and I chose soup. You can still order soup and pick it up to heat it on Wednesday, pick it up on Thursday (from the kitchen refrigerator) and warm it up, OR you can ask that it be delivered to you at home.

*I am still open to requests for your **favorite** soup or to use **your** recipe (thanks to the person who shared a recipe).*

Helpers would be very much appreciated. Starting at 10, we chop, chop, chop, open cans, dump and stir. Then we wash, wash, wash and clean up the mess we made. Around 12:30 PM, we fill the jars with soup and put names on them to fill orders. From 2 – 5 PM, we take the money and put the soup in bags for people to carry. And we pray that the extra soup will be picked up. Come anytime, you will be most welcome and your company appreciated.
